Aeris Resources has multiple Enterprise Agreements one of which is the Tritton Operations Enterprise Agreement which indicates in Clause 26. that there is domestic violence covered in accordance with National Employment Standards.

The "Evolution Mining – Cracow Operations Enterprise Agreement 2019" (Lion Mining) does not provide a provision for domestic violence exclusively, however in application the National Employment Standards would apply.
